This trial will clarify the optimal first-line therapy for newly-diagnosed open-angle glaucoma in Africa (selective laser trabeculoplasty [SLT] versus latanoprost) and will also characterize the relative costs and benefits of a laser-based (SLT repeated as needed) versus medication-based (latanoprost ± timolol) treatment strategy in this region. The lessons learned from this trial will inform treatment decisions for physicians and patients, as well as policy decisions by government and non-government agencies allocating scarce resources for glaucoma care in low-resource settings.
