Genetic Counseling Program Financial Considerations

Work Positions

Genetic counseling students can be successful in securing hourly part time student positions. These positions involve working up to 20 hours a week for a faculty member for an hourly wage. In addition, some positions obtained by students provide them with research experience that can be used for their Master's thesis.

General Scholarships:

There are a few scholarships that genetic counseling students are eligible to apply for, available through the Graduate School of Public Health and the University. When eligible, genetic counseling students have been successful in obtaining these scholarships in the past.

^{*}In some circumstances, students using federal loans may be required to take a minimum of 5 credits per term in the second year. This would result in an additional cost of \$1,122 for Pennsylvania residents and \$1,916 for out of state residents per term in the second year.

Dual Degree: MS in Genetic Counseling/MPH in Public Health Genetics

The total number of credits required to complete the dual degree program is 62 credits. There are different options available for obtaining 62 credits over the course of the program. It is possible to complete the dual degree within 4 academic terms, however, most students complete both degrees within 5 academic terms.
