TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID**School-wide Scholarships**

The Office of Student Affairs announces applications and nominations for these scholarships annually. Students may ask faculty to provide letters of support, and may download an application from the web page address provided in the announcement.

- Campaign for the Next 5000 Alumni:** Nomination by department required
- Dean's Endowed Doctoral Scholarship:** for doctoral students; nomination by department required
- Duncan Scholarship:** priority given to disadvantaged students; nomination by department required
- Goldstein Scholarship:** for students studying either the environmental causes of health disparities or the practice of public health- purpose alternates yearly.
- Commonwealth Fund for Underrepresented U.S. Students:** Nomination by department required

Departmental Scholarships

Several departments have partial scholarship funds. Speak with your department student services coordinator about their availability and the process by which a student is considered.

Traineeships, Fellowships, Assistantships

Each department may award a limited number of student assistantships, usually to doctoral students. Assistantships consist of full or partial tuition support and a stipend in return for certain duties under the supervision of a faculty member. Most initial assistantship appointments are made at the start of the fall term, although occasionally awards may be made in the spring term.

Several departments have traineeships available for student in particular concentrations. In the Department of Epidemiology, pre- and post-doctoral fellowships exist for some concentrations. The Department of Behavioral and Community Health Sciences has traineeships for social workers holding the MSW degree and concentrating in public health social work. The Department of Biostatistics offers pre-doctoral traineeships, as well as a minority health fellowship. The Department of Infectious Diseases and Microbiology offers pre-doctoral and doctoral traineeships.
