Relevant empirical studies are evaluated with an emphasis on the degree to which they test and refine conceptualizations in this area.
3. Research Design and Data Analysis: Psychiatric Epidemiology seminar, Departments of Psychiatry and Epidemiology, University of Pittsburgh, 1984-2000.
This seminar focuses on new developments in research methodology and statistics, with particular emphasis on problems of causal inference with nonexperimental data, analytic strategies for longitudinal data, applications of discrete multivariate analysis, and analysis of clinical trials.
4. Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry Research Methodology: C-L faculty and resident seminar, Department of Psychiatry, University of Pittsburgh, School of Medicine, 1990-1994.
The seminar focuses on design and analytic issues in faculty research proposals and ongoing studies.
5. Epidemiology of Mental Disorders: Pre-and post-doctoral students, Department of Epidemiology, School of Public Health, University of Michigan, Summer 1992, 1993.
The course reviews the descriptive epidemiology of major mental illnesses, considering critical environmental and intrapersonal risk factors for each. Major epidemiologic methods for descriptive and risk factor research are discussed.

The seminar's goals are two-fold.
